Aetiology and disease progression

This looks at the skin changes along a continuum that are visual signs of skin changes associated with venous and lymphatic disease. At the end of this session you should:

- Have a greater knowledge of predisposing conditions that can cause venous or lymphatic disorders
- · Recognise the skin changes associated with venous and lymphatic disease

Theory of compression

This session identifies different theories of compression and how they relate to application of compression. At the end of this session you should:

- Have a greater understanding of the theory of compression in relation to practice
- Understand how different bandage systems work and how to choose the most appropriate for your patient
- Compression hosiery

Vascular assessment

This session looks at vascular assessment and identifies the tools required and when to refer onto vascular services. At the end of this session you should be able to:

- Perform a vascular assessment as required and understand what it is recording
- Identify what level of compression can you apply according to the patients ABPI (Ankle Brachial Pressure Index)

Leg ulcer assessment and management

This session looks at vascular assessment and identifies the tools required and when to refer onto vascular services. At the end of this session you should be able to:

- · Understand the underlying factors predisposing ulceration and non-healing
- Be an effective assessor of lower limb ulceration in determining appropriate management
- Be able to apply evidence-based knowledge and skills to deliver therapeutic management physiology of leg ulceration
- To adopt a new insight into the impact that leg ulcers have on client, carer, and services

Practical skills workshop in how to perform a Doppler to aid diagnosis and management of leg ulceration and lymphoedema. At the end of this session you should be able to:

- · Undertake both hand held and automated Doppler to record ABPI
- · How to measure for off the shelf and made to measure hosiery
- Donning and doffing aids: solutions to the successful application and removal of hosiery

Made to measure hosiery and donning and doffing aids

Practical workshops demonstrating off the shelf compression garments including wraps and made to measure garments. Aids to support application and removal of compression hosiery. On completion of this session you will understand:

- How to measure for off the shelf and made to measure hosiery
- Donning and doffing aids: solutions to the successful application and removal of hosiery
